Violations cited in this report must be corrected within the time frames below, or as stated in sections 8-405.11 and 8-406.11 of the Food Code

14: 4-501.114.(C).(2): C: Quaternary ammonium compound solution concentration is too low or too high.

INSPECTOR NOTES: Multiple surface sanitizing buckets have too low of a Quat ppm. Change solution in buckets more frequently and test regularly.
*COS

53: 6-201.11: N: Floors, walls, and ceilings are not smooth and easily cleanable.

INSPECTOR NOTES: **REPEAT** Kitchen tile flooring is not sealed and is accumulating food debris. Clean, apply grout and reseal floor to be smooth and easily cleanable. Large holes in dining area floor (from old utility lines/services) need to be filled and sealed.

2013 Maine Food Code Adoption:

The Maine Food Code was adopted in October of 2013. Please refer to our website for a copy, <http://www.maine.gov/healthinspection>. Following are a few of the major changes: * No Bare Hand Contact with Ready-To-Eat Food. * Establishments must have clean-up procedures for employees to follow following vomiting and diarrheal events. * Date marking of Ready-to-eat potentially hazardous foods.

Violation Correction Timeframe:

Critical violations should be corrected on site, but in any event, within 10 days. The licensee must contact Louis Lachance when the critical violation has been addressed at 207-513-3125 extension 3224 or at llachance@lewistonmaine.gov. Non-critical violations must be corrected within 30 days. Failure to satisfactorily correct these violations before the follow-up inspection may result in enforcement proceedings by the Department to include fines and penalties. License renewals can be denied if violations are not corrected within the noted timeframes.

C= Critical violation and NC= Non-critical violation:

“Critical violation” means a provision of the Food Code that, if in non-compliance, is more likely than other violations to contribute to food contamination, illness or environmental health hazard.

Additional Inspection Fee:

License fees provide for two inspections per year. When additional inspections are required, the Department may charge an additional \$100 fee to cover the costs of each additional inspection or visit.

Document Retention/Posting:

Pursuant to the Maine Food Code, the establishment's current license must be displayed. In addition, a sign or placard must be posted in a conspicuous area notifying consumers that a copy of the most recent inspection report is available upon request. CFPM certificates must be posted in a conspicuous area and must be available to the Department upon request.
