Observations and Corrective Actions

Violations cited in this report must be corrected within the time frames below, or as stated in sections 8-405.11 and 8-406.11 of the Food Code

1: 2-102.12: N: No Certified Food Protection Manager.

INSPECTOR NOTES: CFPM only present 1 day a week. Acquire a dedicated CFPM for this establishment within 60 days. Show proof to inspector and Health Inspection Program.

6: 2-301.14: C: Food employees are not cleaning their hands and exposed portions of their arms as required.

INSPECTOR NOTES: Employee leaving smoking area, returned to work without washing hands before putting gloves on. All employees must wash hands when returning from break, outdoors, etc. *COS

8: 5-205.11.(A): N: Hand wash facility not accessible.

INSPECTOR NOTES: Handwash sink nearest to grill used to store coffee pot. No items should be in handwash sink to promote correct use. *COS

8: 6-301.11: N: Hand cleanser not available at hand wash sink or lavatory.

INSPECTOR NOTES: Handwash sink in prep area is missing soap and not working. Replace or repair to be in proper working condition.

8: 6-301.14: N: Hand wash signage not provided for employee hand sink or lavatory.

INSPECTOR NOTES: Men's restroom does not have the required sign reminding employees to wash their hands before returning to work.

45: 4-501.11: N: Equipment in disrepair.

INSPECTOR NOTES: Plastic container that catches sliced meats or cheeses is cracked. Discard as it can lead to a physical contaminant and can harbor bacteria as it is not smooth, sealed and easily cleanable. *COS, discarded.

52: 5-501.115: N: Refuse areas and enclosures not maintained free of unnecessary items or not kept clean.

INSPECTOR NOTES: Area where smokers partake is littered with discarded cigarettes. Clean area immediately and maintain.

53: 6-501.12: N: The physical facilities are not clean.

INSPECTOR NOTES: Floors and coving in walk-in cooler have a large build up of old foods. Clean in hard to reach areas more often and as necessary.

2013 Maine Food Code Adoption:

The Maine Food Code was adopted in October of 2013. Please refer to our website for a copy, <http://www.maine.gov/healthinspection>. Following are a few of the major changes: * No Bare Hand Contact with Ready-To-Eat Food. * Establishments must have clean-up procedures for employees to follow following vomiting and diarrheal events. * Date marking of Ready-to-eat potentially hazardous foods.

Violation Correction Timeframe:

Critical violations should be corrected on site, but in any event, within 10 days. The licensee must contact Louis Lachance when the critical violation has been addressed at 207-513-3125 extension 3224 or at llachance@lewistonmaine.gov. Non-critical violations must be corrected within 30 days. Failure to satisfactorily correct these violations before the follow-up inspection may result in enforcement proceedings by the Department to include fines and penalties. License renewals can be denied if violations are not corrected within the noted timeframes.

C= Critical violation and NC= Non-critical violation:

"Critical violation" means a provision of the Food Code that, if in non-compliance, is more likely than other violations to contribute to food contamination, illness or environmental health hazard.

Additional Inspection Fee:

License fees provide for two inspections per year. When additional inspections are required, the Department may charge an additional \$100 fee to cover the costs of each additional inspection or visit.

Document Retention/Posting:

Pursuant to the Maine Food Code, the establishment's current license must be displayed. In addition, a sign or placard must be posted in a conspicuous area notifying consumers that a copy of the most recent inspection report is available upon request. CFPM certificates must be posted in a conspicuous area and must be available to the Department upon request.
